Introduction

From the ancient hilltop caves of the UNESCO World Heritage site of Matera, through the wild loricato pine forested slopes of the Lucanian Dolomites, to the coast at Maratea, where the bright blue Tyrrhenian Sea laps against the cliffs and coves of the shore. This week has it all for children and parents alike. We have a night in a cave hotel, a cookery class delivered by an incredible local Italian cook, an animal tracking walk, river rafting and gorge walking, gelato making, as well as plenty of opportunities for swimming, zip wires, beach time, and some wonderful family meals out, in some of secret southern Italy's most beautiful towns and villages.

Is this holiday for you?

This trip is a taster of one of the wildest corners of Italy. There are some really great activities for all of the family to get involved with, but with plenty of downtime built in too, for independent exploring either as a group, or in your own independent family units.

Basilicata is Italy, off the beaten track. We'll spend much of our time involved in family friendly activities that will get the adrenalin pumping for the kids, in a safe and controlled environment. All safety equipment is provided throughout, by trusted suppliers. We'll stay in small or family run functional accommodation, chosen for their excellent locations.

TRAVEL TO YOUR DESTINATION

In some cases you may choose to take a ferry and/or train to your holiday start and end destination. Please see further information on [Travelling by Train](#).

If flying from the UK there are low cost airlines available to the start and from the end of your holiday.

To benefit from full financial protection, ease your holiday planning, and avoid dealing with airlines, we can book scheduled flights from the UK as part of a flight inclusive package. Scheduled flights are usually more expensive than low cost alternatives, however potentially less stressful if your flight is cancelled or delayed. If you book flights through KE Adventure Travel we will [offset the carbon of your flight](#).

Join at the first night hotel in Matera. Transfers are not available, but there is a train station in Matera, and buses connect Matera with train stations and airports across southern Italy for just a few Euros each way. The railway station in Matera is Matera Centrale. The nearest airport is Bari and a bus from here goes mostly hourly and takes around 1hr 15mins. Check timetables for connections before booking your trains/flights.

Meal Plan

All breakfasts and 2x picnic lunches are included in the itinerary. Cooking class and gelato creations will also be included as part of the experience. All other meals are at own expense.

Food & Water

Water from the taps is perfectly drinkable on this holiday - please use this to fill your personal bottles for your daily activities. We do not encourage the purchase of single-use plastic bottles.

Italian food is famous the world over. Alongside the regular pizzas, pastas, and gelato, there are many local dishes to try. Basilicata is known particularly for its pasta heritage, arguably the first producer of the famous carb, although Emilia-Romagnans would argue otherwise (!) Regular shapes include cavatelli, as the name suggests, like little caves or hollows (although they look like conch shells on the plate, and orecchiette, little ears, also a rolled pasta shape, perfect for holding the flavours of a wide range of tasty sauces. Inland in Basilicata, these are often meaty and rich, lamb (agnello) and pork (maiale) are used regularly in pasta dishes, but also stews, whereas closer to the coast, fish makes it's way onto the menu, utilising the fish and seafood caught regularly in the Tyrrhenian Sea. The most beautiful and impactful of local specialities however, has to be the peperoni cruschi. Hanging from sunny verandas all across the region you will likely find strings of sweet red peppers baking dry in the warm summer sunshine. Once dried they are crushed and added to almost anything served on a plate to add a sweet and smoky (but not spicy) crunch to most dishes.

Accommodation

We have selected small independent and family run guesthouses throughout, on this trip, which allows us to be in or near the centre of most of the villages and towns along the way. The rooms are either double or family rooms to fit with your group size, and will be functional but perfectly formed. What these guesthouses lose in facilities, they make up for in location. For example, in Matera we stay in a cave hotel overlooking the Sassi, and at Maratea, we stay in a cosy B&B nestled in a small square in the old town. They are all perfectly placed to allow for easy access to all the activities and entertainment on this great trip in undiscovered southern Italy.

Group Leader & Support Staff

The group will be led by a professional and qualified tour leader throughout. For the rafting and gorge walking, an additional instructor will join the group.

Spending Money

You will need spending money for drinks and meals out. A typical evening meal will cost around 40EUR per person, drinks are similar in price to UK prices, and you may also wish to purchase souvenirs along the way also. There will be ATMs available along the way, but you may wish to change your money into Euros for a better rate ahead of your trip. Card machines are widely used here, and post covid are preferable in many places, as a means of non-contact payments, so a worldwide interest free credit card may also be useful.

Guidance on Tipping

Tipping is the accepted way of saying 'thank you' for good service. It is important to remember that tipping is voluntary and should be dependent on good service. We estimate around 10EUR per family member.

Baggage Allowance

For this holiday you should take one piece of luggage and a daypack. Luggage with wheels is useful for this holiday. For international flights please check your baggage allowance with your airline.

Group Size & Holiday Status

For each holiday there is a minimum number of participants required to enable it to go ahead. Once the minimum number is reached, the trip status will change from 'Available' to 'Guaranteed to run'. You can check the trip status for each departure in the 'Dates and Prices' table. Other than in exceptional circumstances, we will not cancel a trip once it has achieved this guaranteed to run status so you are free to proceed with your international flight booking and other travel arrangements.

General Information

Passport & Visas

Europe

Your passport must meet 2 requirements. It must be:

- less than 10 years old on the day you enter (check the 'date of issue')
- valid for at least 3 months after the day you plan to leave (check the 'expiry date')

Health & Vaccinations

If you have a severe allergy please inform the KE office before you travel. We will do all we can to help, but we cannot guarantee an allergy free environment on KE trips. You will need to carry your own treatment for the allergy with you, as 'adrenaline auto-injectors' are not carried as standard by KE leaders and staff. You should inform your leader on arrival of your allergy, and let them know where you keep your adrenaline pen.

Vaccinations

You should contact your doctor or travel clinic to check whether you require any specific vaccinations.

GHIC / Medical cover

UK residents should carry a free Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC). This entitles you to state provided medical treatment when you're visiting an EU country or Switzerland. This is not a substitute for medical travel insurance which is vital when travelling overseas.

Currency

The currency for part or all of this holiday is the Euro.

Travel Aware

YOU SHOULD BRING THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

Walking shoes or trainers

Sandals, water shoes, or shoes that are comfortable when wet for rafting

Lightweight walking trousers / shorts / skirt

T-shirts and/or casual shirts

Loose-fitting, long-sleeved shirt with collar (for sun protection)

Socks & Underwear

Lightweight waterproof jacket & overtrousers

Fleece jacket or warm jumper

Sunhat

Warm hat

Sunglasses

Daypack 25-30 litres (depending on how much of the kids' stuff you want to carry)

Sun protection

Insect repellent

Water bottles (approx 2 litre per person) (we encourage re-filling water bottles rather than single use plastic)
